### **Parent Homework Tips**

- 1. Know the Teachers Attend school functions and visit with your child's teacher as much as possible. Ask the teacher for their email address and whether or not they prefer phone calls or emails. Communication with the teacher is important to helping your child.
- 2. Homework Friendly Area Provide an area that is stocked with pencils, pens, paper, rulers, and all the necessary items needed to complete homework every evening. This should be in a place that is free from distractions and clutter.
- 3. Regular Study Time Structure your evening and keep to a schedule as much as possible. This will help the student know that homework and other family time are non-negotiable and to be expected every night.
- 4. Keep Distractions to a Minimum Turn televisions, computers, phones, and all other electronic devices off. If young children are in the home, allow them to go to another room or outside to play to help keep the student from being distracted.
- 5. Set a Good Example Use the homework time to balance your checkbook or read a book. Read a book quietly to younger children. This will set a good example for your child.
